ADMISSION CRITERIA / CRITÉIR IONTRÁLA

The Board of Governors will apply admission criteria to identify children who should be admitted either at initial admission to education P1/R1 or on transfer from another school. In selecting children for admission, children resident in Northern Ireland at the time of their proposed admission to the school will be selected for admission to the school before any child not so resident.

ADMISSION / IONTRÁIL

If the school's admission and enrolment numbers have not been reached the school will admit all children of compulsory school age whose parents wish them to attend the school. If children reach their 4th birthday by 1st July 2020 they are of compulsory school age and should start primary education in September 2020. Parents of children under compulsory school age, who wish their child to be educated through the medium of Irish will be admitted to either of the Irish medium nurseries, in accordance with the admission criteria.





ORGANISATION & MANAGEMENT / BAINISTEOIREACHT AGUS EAGRÚCHÁN

The school is known locally as CBS Armagh but its official name is Christian Brothers' Primary School, Armagh/Bunscoil na mBráithre Críostaí, Ard Mhacha. It is a Catholic maintained school in the trusteeship of The Edmund Rice Schools Trust(NI).

The school enrols both boys and girls aged between 3-11. The enrolment number is 476 of which 195 are in the Irish Medium Unit. We have an admission number of 68 of which 30 are in IME. The present enrolled number in the school is 573.

The Board of Governors meets regularly to manage and oversee the running of the school.

There are six strands to the Christian Brothers' Primary School – English Medium Education, Irish Medium Education, Naíscoíl na mBráithre Críostaí, Naíscoil na Páirce Glaise, Key Stage 1 Autism Class and Key Stage 2 Learning Support Class.

(i) Primary - English Medium Education

Caters for boys and girls of compulsory school age i.e. four years old to eleven years old. Our planned admission for Primary 1 September 2020 is 58. Classes are organised chronologically, taught through English and proceed thus throughout the school. The basic unit is class and teacher.

(ii) Primary - Irish Medium Education

Bunaíodh an t-aonad lánGhaeilge seo i Meán Fómhair na bliana 1995. Teagasctar na buachaillí agus cailíní ann trí mheán na Gaeilge ó Rang 1 go Rang 7. Our Irish Medium Education strand was established in September 1995. Boys and girls from Rang 1-Rang 7 are taught through the medium of Irish.

(iii) Naíscoil na mBráithre Críostaí

Tá sí suite i seomra ranga soghluaiste cóngarach do phríomhfhoirgnimh na scoile. Freastlaíonn an Naíscoil ar pháistí réamhscoile a rugadh idir 02-07-2015 agus 01-07-2016 ar speis lena dtuismitheoirí go gcuirfí oideachas trí Ghaeilge orthu. Glactar leis go leanfaidh na páistí seo ar aghaidh lena gcuid oideachais sa Bhunscoil. Glactar le huasmhéid de 26 páiste sa Naíscoil.

The Naíscoil is located in the specifically designed, blue mobile beside the parent's parking area. It caters for pre school children whose parents wish them to be taught through the medium of Irish. It is anticipated that children attending either of the Naíscolaíocht will continue their primary education in the Christian Brothers' Primary School/Bunscoil na mBráithre Críostaí – English or Irish medium strands. The present enrolment number is 30.

(iv) Naíscoil na Páirce Glaise

Naíscoil na Páirce Glaise is a PEAG's run social services registered Irish Medium playgroup. It is managed by our own Naíscoil Management team. It is situated in a new purpose built Naíscoil and Parents' Room building adjacent to the all-weather pitch which was opened in May 2014. Naíscoil na Páirce Glaise has operated from our school campus for five years and has been fully subscribed with 26 pupils attending each year. The maximum admission number for Naíscoil na Páirce Glaise is 26.

(v) Autism/Learning Support Class

This class caters for children with Autistic Spectrum Disorder across Key Stage 1.

(vi) Key Stage 2 Learning Support Class

This class caters for children in Key Stage 2 with special educational needs. The maximum number to be enrolled in this room is 8.





The Board of Governors has overall responsibility for the effective management of the school. As well as nominees of the Department of Education, Trustees and the Education Authority, its membership also includes an elected parent governor and an elected teacher governor. The Principal completes this team.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR INDUCTION / SOCRUITHE IONDUCHTÚCHÁIN

During the summer term, children to be admitted to Primary 1 and Rang 1 in September, will be invited to come to the school, with their parents, for a morning to meet the teacher and to be provided with additional information. More details will be sent to parents when admission has been approved.

When a child starts school, the day-to-day routine

is very different from that of home and this is a big adjustment for any child. Do reassure him/her by talking happily about school each day and showing no anxiety yourself about the new venture. Remember that your child's attitude will be caught from you.

You can explain that when he/she comes home at the end of the day everything will be waiting as before. Help your child to understand that you want to share this whole exciting adventure. Remember he/she may come home from school tired and without much to say about the day ... so wait until he/she is ready to share it with you ... perhaps at bedtime or in the bath ... and go on from there.

Try to develop a true partnership between home and school and you will have begun a relationship which will benefit your child throughout school life.

School uniform is available from Dessies in English Street, Armagh and Brenda's in Main Street, Keady
Grants towards the cost of uniform may be available to those entitled to benefits.

CHARGES / TÁILLÍ

Education in Christian Brothers' Primary School, Armagh is provided free of charge for all lessons and activities connected with the child's entitlement under the Education Reform Order. Swimming lessons may incur a small charge as the school considers continuity of lessons important.

The school may take part in optional extras, outside of school hours, which are connected to the curriculum. Charges will be made for these e.g. music examinations, music tuition, entrance fees, coaching which are over and above the normal class requisition. Charges will also be made for the purchase of milk and a contribution towards snack.





The school day starts for all children at 9-00am Tósaíonn an lá scoile ar 9.00r.n. do gach páiste.

Parents should note that teacher supervision is not provided before 8.45am or after school hours.

For health and safety reasons children should not arrive at school before 8.45am, unless specifically asked to do so for extra curricular activity.

Punctuality is an integral element in the social skills that both the school and home are trying to develop so please ensure your child arrives at school on time. After school, children who are being collected should wait in the infant playground as it is dangerous to wait outside the school premises.

BREAKFAST CLUB / AN CLUB BRICFEASTA

The Breakfast Club operates daily from **8.05am - 8.45am**. The menu consists of a choice of cereal, toast/marmalade, fruit juice, milk or water. The scheme is operated by two classroom assistants.

MORNING SUPERVISION / MAOIRSEACHT AR MAIDIN

Children who are not attending the Breakfast Club will be supervised by classroom assistants and teachers from **8.45am until the bell rings**.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB / AN CLUB IARSCOILE

The after school club is available to children who attend either English or Irish Medium classes. Details are available from Orla on school telephone number 028 3752 4354. In the club children are given help with written homework. They also get at least one structured activity as well as free play. Cost is available on request.

Sessions are:

First Session (available Year 1-3) 2.00-3.00pm Full Session begins at 2.00pm for Key Stage 1 children and 3.00pm for Key Stage 2 children finishing at 5.30pm.

AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES / IMEACHTAÍ IARSCOILE

The school arranges various after school activities in blocks of 6 week periods throughout the year. Activities are arranged by teaching staff and are as varied as possible to cater for all interests and skills. Details of the after school classes and costs are sent to parents by letter.

SCHOOL MEALS / BÉILTÍ SCOILE

School meals are cooked on the school premises and are of a very high standard. The money for the week or days in the week on which dinner is required should be brought in on Monday morning. Parents entitled to free school meals should make application to EA Southern and be aware that dinners must be paid for until notification has been received.

PACKED LUNCHES / LÓN PACÁILTE

Parents sending a school lunch with their child are reminded that the school operates a Healthy Eating Policy.

ABSENCE / ASLÁITHREACHT

Pupils are not allowed to leave school without permission from the class teacher and/or the school office. If a child is off school parents are asked to provide the school with a valid reason and children leaving early must be collected at the class or office.

HOLIDAY ARRANGEMENTS / SOCRUITHE SAOIRE

The school will be closed for the months of July and August and for all statutory holidays. The school will issue a News Sheet, which will include information about other holidays, i.e. Christmas, Easter, Mid term breaks and some Holy Days of obligation. This will be sent to parents early each term. In the event of an emergency closure every attempt will be made to notify parents to enable them to make alternative arrangements. ILLNESS/ACCIDENTS AT SCHOOL / TINNEAS/TIMPISTÍ AR SCOIL

When a child is sick or injured the school will, in the first place attempt to contact the parent with a view to asking them to come to the school. If this is not possible, the child will be brought to hospital. In less severe cases it would be appreciated if parents would nominate an

emergency contact In all cases, it will be the school policy to act in the best interest of the

child.



School Curriculum - Organisation of Education & Special Education

It is the aim of the Board of Governors of Armagh Christian Brothers' Primary School that all pupils will receive their full entitlement of education under the Northern Ireland Curriculum.

Christian Brothers' Primary School, Armagh will offer a curriculum that is broad and balanced and which promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, intellectual and physical development of the pupils.

We strive to give every child the opportunity to experience success. The curriculum will seek to prepare the pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life. It will also be the aim of the school to maximise the potential of each pupil.

In the CBS we follow the Revised Curriculum. The priorities of the Revised Curriculum are the development of your child's knowledge and understanding, alongside an emphasis in the development of skills.

The Foundation Stage (Primary 1 & 2 / Rang 1 & 2) is designed to give your child opportunities as they start school to learn in practical ways, for example, involving well planned and challenging structured play activities.

Teachers will make use of a wide range of teaching methods, balancing whole class, group and individual activities.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS / SAINRIACHTANAIS SPEISIALTA

At the Christian Brothers' Primary School we aim to maximize the development of our children and to work towards realizing their individual potential. In doing so, teachers will identify children who find the education process more challenging. For those children who are experiencing difficulties, teachers will work with you, as a parent, to identify children's needs and take action to meet them. In consultation with you, the parents, the school may put in place an Individual Educational Plan (IEP) to help address the needs identified.

If educational needs are very significant, the school may seek advice or external support or assessment. (All provision for Special Education needs will be in line with the Code of Practice on Identification & assessment of Special Needs (Education (NI) Order 1996).









ASSESSMENT & RESULTS / MEASÚNÚ AGUS TORTHAÍ

Assessment is an integral part of the NI Curriculum and learning process. Class teachers assess children in different ways, for example by continuous assessment, oral, practical and written tests. Through assessment, teachers build a picture of the progress and the learning needs of each child in order to plan work and aid learning. Year 4 and Year 7 pupils participate in End of Key Stage Assessments and these results are sent to parents in June. The results for Year 7 children, along with their Year 7 report, are sent to their new school. A written report is sent to all parents in June.

REPORTING TO PARENTS / AG TUAIRISCIÚ DO THUISMITHEOIRÍ

Parents will be informed of their child's progress by:

(a) a yearly meeting, in which parents can discuss the school's view of their child's progress.

(b) parents will receive a written yearly report on each pupil's progress at the end of June.

At the end of Key Stage 1 (Primary/Rang 4) and Key Stage 2 (Primary/Rang 7) pupils are assessed by the class teacher in work completed on the revised curriculum and given a level (Year 4 - Levels 1-3) (Year 7 - Levels 1-5)

REWARD PROCEDURES / NÓSANNA IMEACHTA MAIDIR LE DUAISEANNA

The school acknowledges efforts, achievements and contributions to all aspects of school life. To reinforce this we have a system of awards:

Merit Awards

A pupil from each class is rewarded weekly for achievement, receiving a merit certificate and badge, as well as a small reward. They may win a golden ticket which enters them in to a monthly draw for larger prizes. The Principal presents the awards.

Duais ns Gaeilge is a reward system used in the Irish Medium classes to encourage and support pupils to speak Irish to their peers. Five tickets are awarded to pupils in each class throughout the week with an overall winner being selected for special reward and recognition at weekly assemblies.

HOMEWORK / OBAIR BAILE

Homework is given throughout the school as a means of revising work completed in school and to give parents an opportunity to help and encourage their child(ren) in the learning process The amount will vary according to age but it will never be excessive or overburdening.

No set homework is given at week-ends from primaries 1-4 although children are encouraged to read every day.

Parents are encouraged both to read to their children and to listen to their children read.

Parents are asked to sign homework notebooks each night when homework is completed.

There is a Homework policy in place.

DRUGS / DRUGAÍ

At the Christian Brothers' Primary School we are aware of our role in helping your children to develop a healthy lifestyle. We believe that pupils should develop their knowledge and understanding of the use, misuse, risks and effects of drugs (legal and illegal) and other potentially harmful substances. These issues are considered as part of the World Around Us (Science) programme and Personal Development & Mutual Understanding (PDMU) and PE programme.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION / OIDEACHAS REILIGIÚNACH

Children are taught religion using the 'Grow in Love' series throughout the school.

In each class prayers are recited every morning and afternoon. Grace before and after meals is recited by each class.

The school chaplain visits the school regularly and celebrates Mass on special occasions throughout the school year. Each class is encouraged to keep a May altar/sacred place.

In Primary 4 and Rang 4 the children are prepared for First Confession and First Communion.

Primary 7 and Rang 6/7 complete work in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.



PE & GAMES / CORPOIDEACHAS **AGUS CLUICHÍ**

We believe in the importance of a full programme of PE and games which extends the children in several ways:

- As part of a general aim to promote good health and physical well-being.
- The development in each child of a sense of teamwork, co-operation and a healthy attitude towards winning and losing.
- The development of a broad range of skills and co-ordination.
- All children in Key Stage 2 will be given the opportunity to learn to swim. Lessons are provided free for children in Years 5-7.
- On any occasion should a child be unable to participate in PE games, or swimming a note should be sent to the class teacher.
- All children should have suitable footwear for P.E. when this subject is conducted in the School Hall or Gym.

Children from Primary 4-7 and Rang 4-7 must have a PE outfit and a change of footwear to take part in lessons.

We take part in team events with other schools (see extra curricular activities).

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES / IMEACHTAÍ SEACH-CHURACLAIM

The extra curricular activities offered at the school. we consider, add a very valuable dimension to the education of the children. A full range of activities is displayed on the school promotion leaflet.

CHILD PROTECTION PROCEDURES

PASTORAL CARE / CÚRAM TRÉADACH

In line with the policy for maximising the potential of each pupil the school recognises that it has a responsibility to do everything possible to care for the physical and emotional well-being of all pupils. The school will endeavour to provide a comfortable and safe environment for learning.

Each class teacher will have initial responsibility for looking after the pastoral needs of the children in his/her class

Class teachers will attempt to resolve the worries of pupils and to relieve their anxieties.

Class teachers in turn will inform either, Head of Key Stage, the Vice-Principal or the Principal of matters requiring more urgent attention.

The school should be given any information about the child's health or allergies of which the teacher should be aware.

The school has no facilities for dealing with sick children. When a child is sick or injured the school will attempt to contact the parents.

If this is not possible and it is considered the child needs medical attention then he/she will be brought to the Health Centre or Hospital.

In all cases it will be school policy to act in the best interests of the child.

We have a Pastoral Care Policy in place in the school.

BEHAVIOUR / IOMPAR

It is the school policy that behaviour should be based on respect for oneself, respect for other pupils, respect for adults and respect for property. We wish to promote good behaviour through positive rewards on a class and whole school basis. There are weekly and monthly merit awards to recognize children who have stood out amongst their peers. Cases of minor misbehaviour are recorded by the class teacher and, if necessary, parents are asked to come and discuss unacceptable behaviour with the class teacher. In serious cases of misbehaviour parents will be contacted.

Parents may receive a written report, or be invited to come to the school to discuss the matter with the teacher or principal. There is a policy on behaviour in the school.





GENERAL COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE / MODH DÉANTA GEARÁN

From time to time parents, and others connected with school will become aware of matters which cause them concern. To encourage resolution of such situations the governing body has adopted a 'General Complaints Procedure.'

The procedure is devised with the intention that it will:

- Usually be possible to resolve problems by informal means
- Be simple to use and understand
- Be non-adversarial
- Provide confidentiality
- Allow problems to be handled swiftly
- Address all the points at issue and
- Inform future practice so that the problem is unlikely to recur.


Children are taught in line with the pre-school Curricular Guidance Document which follows the seven areas of the Pre School Curriculum:
